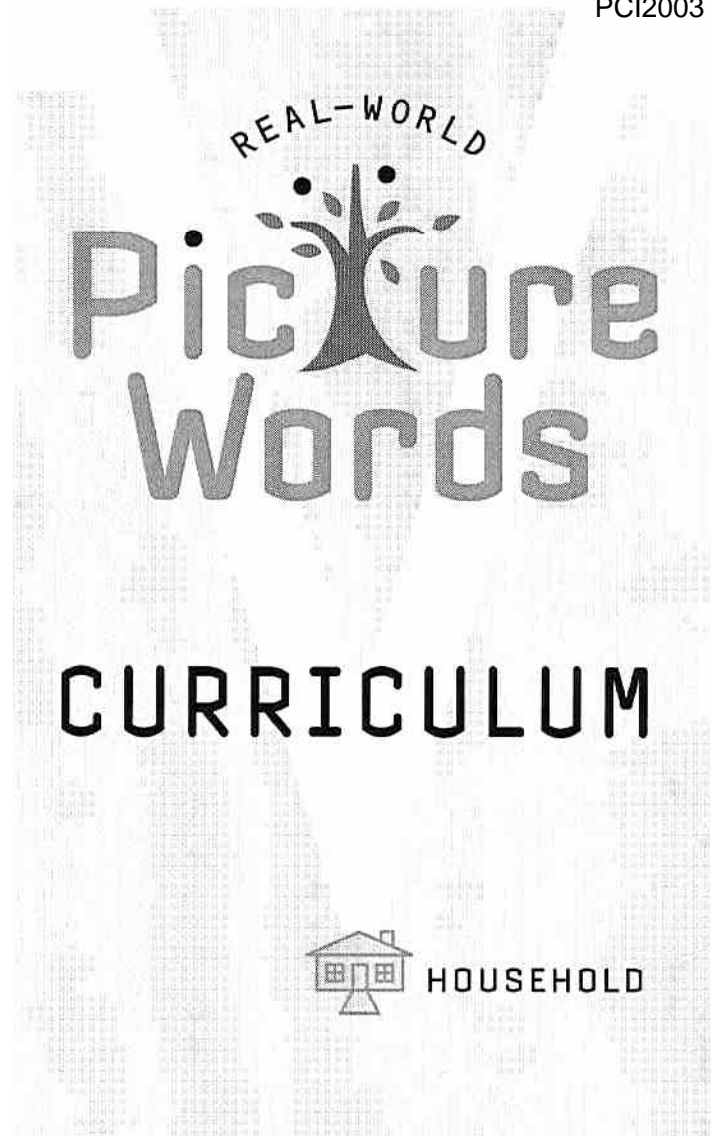

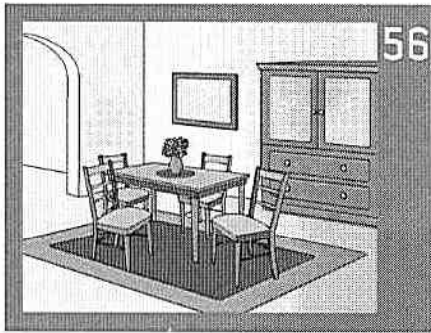

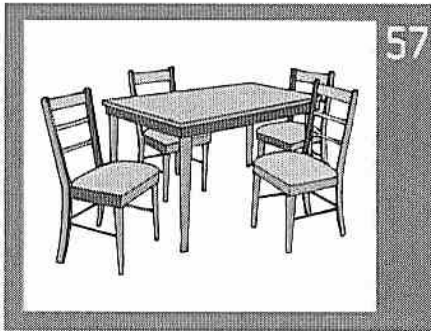

dining room

DEFINITION A dining room is a room in a house where people eat meals. A dining room usually has a dining table. Some people only use their dining room for special meals.

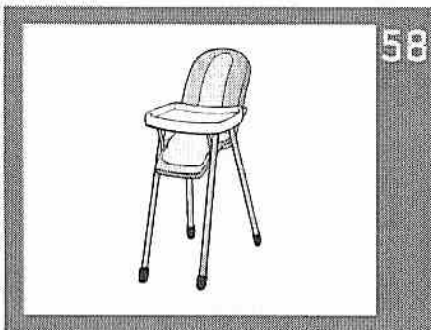
SENTENCE The dining room had a large window that looked out to the front yard.



dining table

DEFINITION A dining table is a piece of furniture that has a large, flat top held up by legs. A dining table has room for many chairs so that people can sit around it to eat.

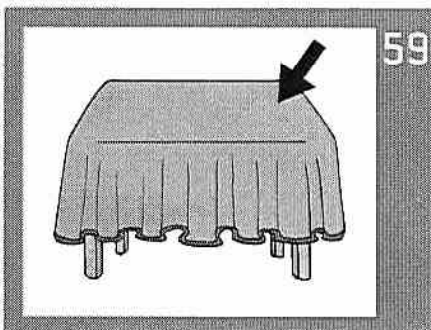
SENTENCE The family bought a new dining table at the furniture store.



highchair

DEFINITION A highchair is a small seat with tall legs that babies and toddlers sit in at mealtime. The chair has a removable food tray and a safety strap.

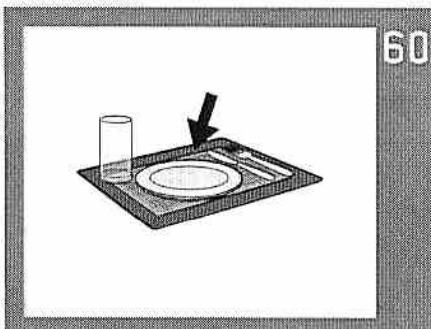
SENTENCE The floor under the baby's highchair was very messy.



tablecloth

DEFINITION A tablecloth is a large piece of fabric that can be placed over the top of a dining table to protect the surface when people eat. Some tablecloths are made of paper or plastic for special occasions.

SENTENCE The grandmother chose a special tablecloth for the holiday meal.



place mat

DEFINITION A place mat is a small piece of cloth, plastic, or paper that is placed on a table before setting it. People use place mats to protect and decorate tables.

SENTENCE The man spilled salad dressing on his place mat.

56. dining room

Possible Group Activities

56. dining room — Review that some families only use their dining rooms for special meals. Have students describe times their families eat in the dining room.
57. dining table — Ask students to use the Internet to print pictures of the styles and sizes of dining tables they would like to have in their first homes as adults.
58. highchair — Lead a discussion on how old a person usually is when he or she moves from a highchair to a booster seat and then to a regular dining chair.
59. tablecloth — Furnish art supplies, and have each student design a tablecloth that could be used during his or her favorite season of the year.
60. place mat — Bring in cloth, plastic, and paper place mats, and have students name times that would be appropriate to use each of the different types.

Teacher Read-Aloud

Ben and his dad are cooking a surprise birthday dinner for his mom. She has been out shopping for the afternoon with friends and will be home in about an hour.

To get ready, Ben places a blue tablecloth on the dining table in the dining room. Then, he sets a white and blue place mat at each place setting. For fun, his dad ties two balloons to Ben's baby sister's highchair. As a special treat, they bought a fresh flower arrangement to place in the center of the table. The menu for tonight includes spaghetti and meatballs with french-style green beans. Ben thinks his mother is really going to be surprised when she gets home.

Follow-up Question: How would you decorate the dining room for your mom's birthday?
