HOW TO PLAY

STARTING THE GAME: Playing pieces should be placed on the word "GO," and the die should be rolled to determine which player goes first.



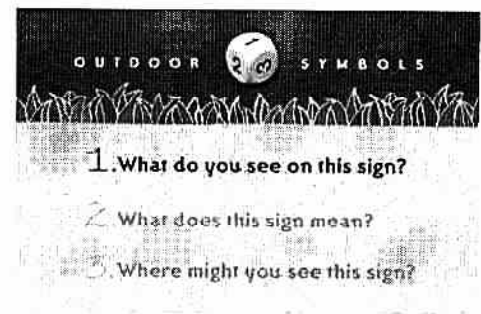
ROLLING THE DIE: The first player rolls the 1, 2, 3 die and moves the corresponding number of spaces on the game board, landing on either a survival sign symbol game-board square or a game-die square.



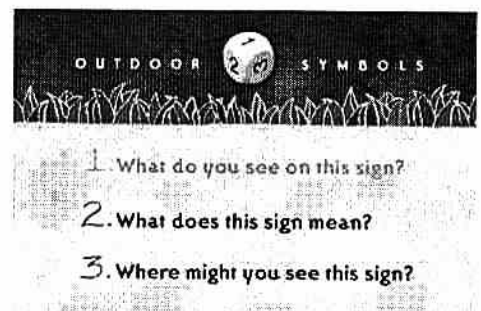
LANDING ON A SURVIVAL SIGN SYMBOL: When a player lands on a game-board square with a survival sign symbol, for example, "Airport," he or she looks at the number rolled on the die again and finds the matching number (1, 2, or 3) on the question stand to determine which question to answer.



USING THE QUESTION STAND: The question stand has three questions. If a player rolls a "1" on the die, he or she is asked the first question, "What do you see on this sign?" For example, if a player lands on the "Airport" survival sign symbol, he or she might answer, "There is an airplane." The exact phrasing of the response is unimportant.



LANDING ON THE SAME SYMBOL: If a player lands on a symbol a second time in the same game, review the question stand to see which question(s) have already been answered. For example, if a player rolls a "1" on the die both times, he or she can roll again to try to get a "2" or "3" for a different question.



LANDING ON A GAME-DIE SQUARE: When a player lands on a game-board corner with a 1, 2, 3 die pictured, he or she gets to roll the die again.
